They were able to complete 18 service projects in Sidney and Shelby County. The 2018 campaign was another success because of your generosity. The campaign theme was “United We Win”. At our campaign kickoff we recognized two new partner agencies, the Sheriff’s STAR House and Agape Distribution. The STAR House opened in the summer of 2019 and Agape serves over 7000 people each year food from their pantry.

The campaign goal was set at \$1.34 million dollars, an increase of \$15,000 from the previous year. Today I am pleased to share current pledges for the 2018 campaign stand at over \$1.38 million dollars. THANK YOU TO CORPORATE LEADERSHIP GIVING

The 2018 campaign theme was United We Win. During the year we added two new partner agencies, the Sheriff's STAR House and Agape Distribution. This would not be possible without the loyal and compassionate donors who continue to support the Shelby County United Way.

During 2018, the Shelby County United Way supported 27 partner agency programs and awarded 18 special project grants. We facilitated the Day of Action with 23 companies participating. We had 167 volunteers provide 850 volunteer hours while completing 18 community based service projects. This has already expanded in 2019.

Student United Way with one junior and one senior from every Shelby County high school started a second year. They meet monthly to learn about community issues and partner agencies. They were provided a \$10,000.00 allocation budget to award to youth based programming in the community. They identified mental health counseling, substance abuse prevention, and food insecurity as focus areas to accept applications. Awards were made in the spring of 2019.

Our women's initiative group POWER continues to coordinate the kindergarten tutoring program. We have been working closely with Sidney City Schools during their re-organization of the district and are finalizing our recruiting efforts for the 2019-2020 school year. During the 2018-2019 school year, we had 14 classrooms benefit from a tutor. We were assigning tutors to 42 weekly slots as some teachers requested a tutor 5 days a week. Both the volunteers and the students are finding this a rewarding experience. Teachers are seeing progress and appreciate the program.

I am pleased to share that campaign pledges have exceeded \$1.38 million dollars, exceeding our goal of \$1.34. We had 288 companies participate in the campaign and 101 companies contribute a corporate gift. Corporate gifts this year totaled \$472,045 representing 34.1% of the campaign.

We continue to evaluate agency programming during the allocation process to ensure United Way dollars are being invested for the greatest outcomes. As appropriate, new agencies or programs are funded. In addition, we collaborate with our elected and civic leaders to discuss and evaluate our community's greatest concerns.

I would like to thank the companies and corporate leaders that supported the campaign with a corporate gift and the many companies that coordinated a workplace campaign, to allow their employees to participate. Your gift is impacting our community for the better every day, every hour, and every minute.
